

## CHAPTER I

### INTRODUCTION

In this chapter researcher will present and discuss the introduction about background of the study, research problem of the study, objective of the study, hypothesis of the study, significance of the study, scope and limitation of the study, and the definition of key term.

#### A. Background of the Study

English is an international language that can be means of communication in communicating between different countries. Speaking of English in general, there are four skills in learning English, namely reading, writing, listening and speaking skills. These four skills are skills that must be learned and mastered for someone who wants to learn English. Maybe for some people think that pronunciation is not important to master, they think only speaking skills and vocabulary are important skills in learning English.

One of them is the research carried out by Asri Tiara Farhati with the title "*The Effectiveness of English Songs as Media to Enhance Student's Ability to Pronounce English Voiced Plosive Consonants [b, d, g]*". He explained that the use of English songs as a medium for teaching pronunciation, especially in teaching English voiced plosive sounds [b, d, g], is very effective to use because it can improve students' pronunciation. He also said that his students still find it difficult to pronounce words in plosive consonants in English, especially the sound [d] which is at the end of the position.<sup>3</sup>

Another research on this issue was conducted by Adelia Yusmita and Nike Angraini with the title "*The Effect of Engling Song on The Seventh Grade Student's Pronunciation Achievement in SMP Srijaya Negara Palembang*". He said that using English songs can help students improve their pronunciation such

2. Alternative Hypothesis (Ha) : There is effect of the use of English song on pronunciation of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester students in IAIN MADURA.

From the two hypotheses, the above researchers tend to use alternative hypotheses (Ha) because researchers believe that there is of English song on pronunciation of 2<sup>nd</sup> semester students in IAIN MADURA.
