

## **CHAPTER IV**

### **RESULT AND DISCUSSION OF RESEARCH**

As a result of the research, the researcher presents the findings. The goal of the research findings and discussion is to provide an answer to the research problem raised in the first chapter. In this study, there are two goals. The first step is to identify the types of slang used by TBI students at IAIN Madura on WhatsApp personal chatting. The second goal is to learn the meanings of the slang used by TBI students at IAIN Madura on WhatsApp personal chatting. The data collected in the field are presented based on the interviews and documentation with the students.

#### **A. Result of Research**

The researcher discusses the types and meanings of slang used by TBI students at IAIN Madura on WhatsApp personal chatting. The data were gathered through interviews in order to answer the research objectives of this study.

##### **1. The Types of The Slang Used on WhatsApp Personal Chatting by TBI Students at IAIN Madura**

The researcher conducted telephone interviews with TBI students at IAIN Madura. Interviews were conducted to determine the outcome of this objective research.

The process of shortening words is known as abbreviation, and it is most commonly used in writing to represent complete forms. The researcher questioned the students about the types of slang used by TBI students at IAIN Madura on WhatsApp personal chatting.

a. Respondent 1

The researcher discovered the types of slang used by a TBI student named Mely safarina firdaus through her WhatsApp personal chat after interviewing her. The student used to communicate via WhatsApp, which could be proven through an interview with the student;

“Slang is a type of language used by teenagers or specific social groups to communicate informally. I use those slang types when conversing with my friends in person or on social media, particularly the WhatsApp.Oxbridge (Oxford and Cambridge), OMG (Oh My God), and ATM are some of the slang terms I frequently use (automated teller machine). in a conversation, for example;

Data 1

Anindia : *Mbak*

Mely : *Uy..*

Anindia : I need you know

Mely : *Apa tuh?*

Anindia : Can I borrow your Oxbridge and your CD please?

Mely : *Wahh..* I don't have Oxbridge

Mely: : IDK so far, you can search by your Shope , terus kamu bisa FAQ *tuh di storenya sebelum kamu beli*

Anindia : *oh kalau gitu aku mau minta tolong km ya mbak..*

Anindia : I will transfer my money to you by ATM

Mely : Ok

Data 2

Luluk : Did know how my feeling today?

Mely : No, I dunno, What's up?

Luluk : OMG, I am so happy today bcs I found new skincare

I learned from using slang words that; for the positive impact, it can make our language more diverse, and it also strengthens my relationship with my friends because we can talk

freely. And I'm not familiar with slang when I'm chatting with my bestie.”<sup>1</sup>

b. Respondent 2

In the second data, the researcher discovered that slang language is a simple language to understand. Furthermore, many young people use slang. It was possible to demonstrate this during the interview with the student;

“Slang is a modern language that is commonly used in everyday conversation. Young people are more likely to use slang languages. When I'm chatting with my friends on WhatsApp, I use slang like "oh my goodness," which makes typing easier for me and appears to be a modern people's habit. I don't know who the real Lin is when it comes to types or classifications, hehe. But I mostly read on social media, particularly in IG comments, where people say things like... So, when I was browsing the meanings, I got caught, and it turned out to be slang words. In my emm, I use slang... slang language in order to exist in society, to make English learning easier, and to foster critical thinking about emm... language

Linda : *oww ciap* thanks *bu*

Ella : *Wokee sama-sama*

Linda : Oh my goodness, thank ya el for your information!!

Ella : you are welcome”<sup>2</sup>

c. Respondent 3

In this data, the researcher discovered that the student used slang while chatting with her friend, particularly in an informal setting. It was possible to demonstrate this during the interview with the student:

“... I believe slang language is emm... Teenagers do not use formal language. So far, I don't know anything about slang. If the term is familiar to me, I conclude that it is slang. I don't understand if I don't know. Simple and easy to use, such as "RIP, (arghh), (opps), I communicate with my friend, via WhatsApp, the majority of whom are teenagers, but adults also use it." The effect is entirely positive. So, in my opinion, we use slang when chatting or speaking with a friend or in an informal

setting. We must be able to understand the language that is being used. It is a simple language that is used in everyday situations. For example, we use slang 'argh' to tell them when we want to tell them something irritating, or opps, RIP when we want to tell them something tragic. when we want to tell something annoying, or opps, RIP when we want to tell them in a chat room. If you don't know, it's make awkward. Otherwise there will be misunderstandings. just positive, and then, there is no negative impact about slang language For example;

Wulan : Afnan....

Wulan : arghhh!!! Where are you?

Afnan : opps sorry lan, aku gapegang hp.

Afnan : yo.. wulan have you watching infotainment this morning?

Wulan : Not yet nan, I have something to do this morning. What news?

Afnan : is about Mr. Abdul, remember when you listen to his explanation about English in my phone?

Wulan : Oh yesss, in tiktok app right? What's wrong with him?

Afnan : he passed away lan

Wulan : RIP Mr. Abdul

This example is just for fun and is very simple, and I believe the word "arghh" is an annoyed expression, and it is informal. And shortened from something like "RIP," but if your interlocutor doesn't understand what you're saying, it'll be awkward."<sup>3</sup>

#### d. Respondent 4

The researcher discovered a student who uses slang to express the types. Slang forces you to express your emotions, both happy and sad. Furthermore, what you say to others will be easier to understand.

It was possible to demonstrate this during the interview with the student:

“Emm... slang is a non-formal language. Slang is a modern language that is commonly used in everyday conversation. When I'm on WhatsApp with my friends, I use slang. Slang language can be found in social media and daily activities. Slang is a modern language that is commonly used in everyday conversation. When I'm on WhatsApp with my friends, I use slang. In this case, DM (direct message), pop (popular) It makes typing easier for me and appears to be a modern people's habit. I don't know who the real Lin is when it comes to types or

classifications, hehe. But I mostly read on social media, particularly in IG comments, where people say things like, "I frequently use two types of slang, namely abbreviation and word." For example, DM, Exam, Pro, and Pop. So, when I was browsing the meanings, I got caught, and it turned out to be slang words. When we use slang language in our daily activities, communication, or social media, I believe it is simple to use and emm... I believe it becomes habit because it is simple and practiced and emm... Cepet, singkat gitu lin.

As an example, consider chat.

Data 1

Nurul : Din, IMO how about if you DM her Instagram to ask about our business?

Nurul : Stop goffing off

Didin : Good idea,

Didin : But I am afraid disturbing her time

Nurul : Don't be shy

Nurul : She is a nice person

Nurul : Please DM her Instagram ASAP okay

Data 2

Ferdy : Hai sis

Ferdy : Tomorrow exam?

Nurul : I hadn't, any problem?

Ferdy : I need Pro teacher, can you teach me/ I want to prepare for about some exam.

Data 3

Afnan : have you see the ad of angga yunanda, about his new movie?

Nurul : IDK afnan, why about him, is he pop?

Afnan : ya he is pop right now

Afnan : Because of his new serial Antares."<sup>4</sup>

e. Respondent 5

The researcher discovered the students who needed to know the different types of slang in this data. It is assumed that the student is familiar with Google. It will make the conversation more interesting by introducing difficulties such as slang in quotations, swearing, and so on. It was possible to demonstrate this during the interview with the student:

"I don't know much about slang, but emm... Hmm... I don't know much about slang, but emm... Slang language, in my

I mean, sometimes using slang language causes emm... other, other people to be unable to understand what, what we say.. Emm... when we use slang language in daily activity or communication or in social media, I think it is simple to use and emm... I think emm... become habit because simple and practice and emm... *singkat gitu lin, cepet*. I often use to kinds of slang namely abbreviation. Such as LOL, OTW.

For example;

Data 1

Nuriatul : Yesterday, did you ask me to chat him?

Nuris : IDK forget it

Nuriatul : OMG, I also forget it. So until now, I have not snet him message to make an appointment

Nuris : It is better for you to sent him message now, I'm not sure that we can visist him tomorrow because he is very busy.

Nuriatul : J/K via, I have sent him message last night, but until now , there is no response from him.

Nuris : LOL

Data 2

Betty : I need Gas *mbak* I want to go to Lab right now.

Nuriatul : Ok so what can I do for you?

Betty : You can pick me up at dorm? I share you maps

Nuriatul : OTW,<sup>5</sup>

#### f. Respondent 6

The research discovered the student's statement that the student frequently uses slang talk or chatting in this data. It is caused by the student himself, as the beginner appears to be having fun and being cool.

It was possible to demonstrate this during the interview with the student:

“Slang language is a language that teenagers frequently use. I discover Social media is used in daily communication. I'm having a conversation with some of my closest friends. It's simple. However, this is not a problem because everyone is familiar with slang. If I use slang while speaking or chatting

Afnan : Oh ya? Then I will see the ad tomorrow

Mareta : ok back to the topic gabut wkwk, where did you buy the bra. Sorry I just question . LOL

Afnan : OMG Why you talk about bra, fyi my mom always but it for me

Mareta : spill merk bra yang bagus dong on shoppe

Afnan : (sent a picture)

Data 3

Mareta : Reminder sis, DR , I need your help and I am very angry. And you know, I need you, if you go to mart. I want to brunch

Afnan : Your so random sist, but okay sure I’ll help you”<sup>6</sup>

#### g. Respondent 7

The researcher found the student’s statement. She used slang in informal situation by particular group or people.

“Young people or informal situations use this language. I may use slang in private messages, as well as some comics or chat. I use it with my friends because it is very simple and easy to understand when chatting through WhatsApp. In my experience, my friends and a specific group will sometimes say that I use the wrong language, and they will judge and correct my message or something else. Slang makes chatting more practical and convenient because it eliminates the need to type long sentences. But I'm not sure what slang terms I should use. When adik tingkat chats with me and asks about the company, I come across the slang word CEO. I believe this word is slang because it is nonformal, creative, and informal. Please correct me, ya lin.

For example;

Wiwik : kak, may I ask you for about company? Especialy *lamaran kerja di lembaga*.

Dila : *Boleh dek*

Wiwik : Could you explain me about rule?

#### h. Respondent 8

In this data, the researcher discovered that the student's statement is about the type of reference that they discovered on social media. He makes the statement slang more trendy, casual, and saves time. It was possible to demonstrate this during the interview with the student:

“ As I understand it, slang is a colloquial term for words that are commonly used in informal situations. Slang language can be found on many social media platforms, as well as in e-mail and SMS platforms. So, the reason is to shorten the time and make it less long, as well as to make my status less formal and more important to others. CMIW (correct me if I'm wrong), for example (brother). I only have Twitter, so you might be able to take a lot. I frequently use slang on Twitter and possibly on WhatsApp. Usually, celebrities and foreign users use social media to express themselves, and they always use slang. You can become more trendy and also if you use slang language you can save more time and you can be more casual just it. there is a negative impact, such as you know when you use only slang language in informal situation, I think you will you know, you will not changeable in formal situation because can use it in formal situation.

Fauzi : Btw, have you finished your speaking task, dude?

Della : Nope, I haven't done it yet

Fauzi : Hmm, actually I'm still confused about oration

Della : I am confused about the difference between speech and oration.

Fauzi :AFAIK, oration usually used to inform our argumentation about something, so that it can be straightened out and repaired and it takes place outdoor, I guess. heheh CMIW ya del<sup>8</sup>

#### i. Respondent 9

The researcher discovered in this data that the student has a lack of slang vocabularies, which causes the student to be confused about the

meaning on WhatsApp chatting. It was possible to demonstrate this during the interview with the student:

“I believe slang is not a formal language. In my opinion, informal language is that emm... slang is that informal language that people create. Emm... because I believe it is more comfortable for us and also more practical, emm... it has become a habit. What I know about slang is that it is a type of language that is commonly used by teenagers in informal situations, such as when talking to friends. As a result, it should not be used in a formal setting. Furthermore, it includes not only words but also phrases. Those who do not understand this language may find it strange, but those who are familiar with it may find it creative and unique. When I text my friends, such as my classmates, I use it. Essentially, I use it for those who understand it. I also use it in public speaking at times. UNESCO, UNICEF, and other organizations Not only that, but I also use slang phrases like "how's it going?" Its application distinguishes it. I mean, when I use it in a chat, it makes my chat stand out, and it's a great language variation to use because not everyone knows how to use it. However, while discussing the corona with my friends, I came across slang terms such as HIV, UNICEF, and UNESCO. For example;

Hanif : *eh bro, sekarang marak-maraknya covid, kalau kayak HIV, itu rentan gak she terpapar COVID-19?*

Cinday : *kalau menurutku sih iya bro. soanya HIV itu yang bermasalah dengan sistem kekebalan tubuh. Jadi pengidap HIV lebh tinggi resikonya kena covid.*

Hanif : *aku melihat berita di akhir 2020. Presentasi kak Iman usman dalam konferensi online UNESCO itu bro yang aku baca di artikel mengenai inofasi ruang guru di masa pandemi. Gahnya itu bro, jadi terinspirasi juga melihat mbak gigi hadid pas jadi volunteer UNICEF kalau gasalah bro ”<sup>9</sup>*

j. Respondent 10

The researcher discovered that the student statement in this data.

Slang is a type of language used by teenagers or certain types of personal chatting to communicate informally. It was possible to demonstrate this during the interview with the student:

“Activities in informal language, and slang is also a language that is not in the dictionary because it is informal. I used it while chatting with friends” (informal situation), I also frequently use slang while chatting with friends, and I frequently use it with my close friends. Hmm... whatsapp, then instagram, then messenger. RAM (random access memory) is an abbreviation I use (information). It makes it easier for us when we are lazy to type long and also don't spend a lot of time, add new knowledge, of course, and I believe that slang is a language that is short, clear, and also suitable for use when chatting with friends, particularly when chatting on WhatsApp. The first time I thought English chatting was the same as Indonesian chatting, I was confused about how to combine the grammatical structure in a sentence when we were chatting on WhatsApp. In my opinion, slang language is 'bahasa gaul,' which we frequently use when talking/chatting with others. especially if talk/chatting with our friend. i use slang when i Talking or chatting with a friend because it appears 'gaulish' or, more simply, the impact when I use slang, especially in WA. Because I understand the meaning of that slang, it can make me appear cool or gaul. because no one understands the meaning of that slang

For example:

Dina : you know info beli RAM murah dimana ya?

Cira : coba di Mega Duta dek”<sup>10</sup>

The researcher concluded from the above interviews that there are many variations among students in terms of the types of slang they use. They only understand that slang is used when the tense is short and informal.

## **2. The Meaning of The Slang Used on WhatsApp Personal Chatting by TBI Students at IAIN Madura**

The researcher gathered documentation of the TBI students' screen shoot chatting at IAIN Madura. The audience of the documentation is the documentation of the screen shoot. These are the ones discovered by the researcher while the students were chatting.

Wulan : arghhh!!! Where are you?

Afnan : opps sorry lan, aku gapegang hp.

Afnan : yo.. wulan have you watching infotainment this morning?

Wulan : Not yet nan, I have something to do this morning. What news?

Afnan : is about Mr. Abdul, remember when you listen to his explanation about English in my phone?

Wulan : Oh yesss, in tiktok app right? What's wrong with him?

Afnan : he passed away lan

Wulan : RIP Mr. Abdul".<sup>12</sup>

Students get multiple languages when typing on WhatsApp, as stated in the documentation. Chatting demonstrates this. The findings of research on TBI students while chatting on WhatsApp with friends revealed that the slang used was an abbreviated form, as revealed by the results of this meeting with the results of documentation carried out by the audience.

This data that the researcher discovered in the student's chatting was about the meaning that makes the student more comfortable than using formal language used on WhatsApp personal chatting by TBI students at IAIN Madura. The findings of this interview are supported by the findings of audience documentation. The findings of audience documentation on TBI students while chatting on WhatsApp with their friends show that the slang used is in the form of abbreviation. The meaning of findings in the screenshot is laboratory (laboratorium). This entails A laboratory is a place where experiments are carried out.

The data on screen shoot;

Ani : Mmmm gimana ya, tapi agak siangan gapapa ya?

Ifah : It's okay, I will wait you

Ani : sure

Ani : what are you doing go to lab?

Ani : I will check blood donors

## B. Discussion

The researcher discussed the research findings based on the research findings. The topic of the discussion is the types of slang used on WhatsApp personal chatting by TBI Students at IAIN Madura, as well as the meanings of the slang used on WhatsApp personal chatting by TBI Students at IAIN Madura. Because the data was still drawn, the researcher needed to analyze it after describing it. It fit with the solution to the problem statements. The explanations are as follows:

### 1. The Types of The Slang Used on WhatsApp Personal Chatting by TBI Students at IAIN Madura

Based on the result of research findings, the TBI students at IAIN Madura. slang divided into four parts, namely; abbreviations, blending, clipping and interjection.

#### a. Abbreviation

Abbreviations are types formed by pronouncing the first letters of any or all of the words in a phrase or title as if they were a single

### 1) Initialism

Slang language has imitation words, which are produced by imitating specific sounds. As the name implies, initialism is the shortening of English words by placing certain letters in front of the word so that when said, most people will only mention the initials of each word contained in the word.

#### a) FAQ

Initialism is a type of abbreviation that is formed by the first letters of the words and read by spelling each word. To clarify the definition, the researcher provides some examples of data to be discussed further below:

Respondent 1:

Nindi : Can I borrow your Oxbridge and your CD please?  
 Mely : *Wahh..* I don't have Oxbridge  
 Mely: : IDK so far, you can search by your shope , terus kamu bisa FAQ *tuh di storenya sebelum kamu beli*<sup>17</sup>

Nindi requested that I purchase an Oxford dictionary based on the information provided above. FAQ stands for Automated, F stands for Frequently, A stands for Asked, and C stands for Questions. Mely used "FAQ" in the preceding

conversation because the type is similar to “asked.”

b) CEO

An initialism, also known as an alphabet, is a word in which each letter stands for another word. In an initialism, however, each letter is pronounced individually, as if the word were being spelled. CEO is an abbreviation for "chief executive officer." Because it is pronounced cee-ee-oh rather than cee-oh, CEO is an initialism rather than an acronym.

To clarify the definition, the researcher provides some examples of data to be discussed further below:

Respondent 7:

Dila : *Boleh dek*

Wiwik : Could you explain me about rule?

Dila : *Untuk lamaran kerjanya nanti kamu tinggal*

*ada interview langsung sama CEO nya”<sup>18</sup>*

The term "App" is used not only for internet slang language, but also for other types of language. There is no doubt that people will immediately understand the meaning of App when they use it on the internet.
