CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

In this chapter, the researcher explains introduction of research, that consist of research context, research problems, research objectives, significance of study, scope and limitation, and definition of key terms.

A. Research Context

Speaking ability in second language has attracted a lot of attention ever since it becomes an international language. As a result of this shift from traditional to communicative approaches to language teaching, speaking has been recognized as a branch of language teaching and learning in its own right,¹ so that one of the aims in English class is to develop the communication skills of the students so that they can express themselves properly using the target language based on their social and cultural contexts. To attain the targets teachers apply different teaching techniques in the classroom. Nevertheless, it is widely known that in the teaching and learning processes there is no best single approach or technique.

Most of people say that if we have learned English and we involved to the society, one thing that they want to know is how to we speak English.

Because from four basics of English, one of skills that can be a tool for communication is speaking skill, as like Thornbury said that speaking is so much a party of daily life that we take it for granted, the average person produces ten thousands of words a day, although some people like auctioneers or politicians may produce even more than it.²It means we as a human that can communicate with many people are often produces many words a day, so that Speaking is the first target for many students who learn English generally, speaking seems to be an important skill that the learner should acquire since one the major responsibilities of any teachers working with English language learners is to enable students to communicate effectively through oral language. There are more than 50 students graders from BBEC take success in speaking skill as the main priority in learning a foreign language, the success of BBEC's graders measure from when they speak English, because mastering speaking skill is a measurement whether they have mastered the others skills.

Nowadays, in the real teaching and learning of speaking in BBEC Mambaul Ulum Bata-Bata, most of the students have difficulty in their speaking skill because they only rely on the time of course, without any additional time, in this case BBEC's tutor have one of alternative to develop members' speaking skill with one of program in BBEC, it name is weekly meeting program, weekly meeting program here used by the tutor of BBEC and hope this program can increase the members' of BBEC in speaking.

Weekly meeting here is one of programs in a week used by the official of BBEC to increase members' speaking skill, weekly meeting usually hold in Friday night where a teacher obligate every members' to perform in front of others members with a roles every week. It means that in weekly meeting program here there is a delegation of group demanded to perform an activity. As like in the first meeting the delegation of group perform a speech. Then the other members being attention while waiting the next delegation to perform.³

Based on the background above, the researcher interest to do this study because the researcher wants to know how weekly meeting program applied to members' speaking skill, therefore the researcher hopes to finish this study better. In this case the researcher creates entitled of this study "The Implementation of Weekly Meeting Program to help Members' Speaking Skill at Bata-Bata English Centre (BBEC) in Mambaul Ulum Bata-Bata Pamekasan".

B. Research Focus

C. Research Objective

E. The Scope and Limitation

Creswell state that Limitation is the potential weaknesses or problems in the study that identified by the researcher.⁷ The scope of this research is the Implementation of Weekly Meeting Program to help Members'

F. Definition of Key Terms

The definitions of key terms are important in this study in order to avoid misinterpretation, misunderstanding and misconception between the researcher and the reader. Creswell suggests us to begin our research of the literature by narrowing our topics to a few key terms using one or two words of short phrases.⁸ By knowing key terms one by one, the reader gets simple to read further discussion. Therefore, the researcher here wants to identify the definitions of key terms as follow:

- 1. Implementation is the way how tutor apply weekly meeting program to help members speaking skill.
- Speaking is one of basic skills in English that most of students expect to master.
- 3. Weekly meeting program is one of activity in a week at BBEC that used by BBEC's tutor to help members' speaking skill, weekly meeting is the special meeting in a week that the all of members of BBEC come together in a place and do an that related with speaking activity and speak up in
